





A Neglected Viewpoint in Infant Feeding

That the modern scientific system of infant feeding is theoretically excellent is undoubted. It is perhaps a little regrettable, however, that the learned gentlemen who evolved this elaborate technique did not pay a little more attention to the point of view of the people actually charged with its execution, viz. the parents of the infant.
