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Background



What is quality health care?

Quality health services should be:

Effective	Evidence-based healthcare services for those who need them.
Safe	Avoiding harm to patients during care.
People-centred	Care that respects individual preferences, needs, and values.
Timely	Reducing waiting times and harmful delays.
Equitable	Care quality does not vary by gender, race, location, socio-economic status.
Integrated	Full range of health services across the life course.
Efficient	Maximising resource use and avoiding waste.

Background



a person seeking health care services purchased for his or her benefit by the Fund from an **accredited** health care service provider or health establishment must be registered as a user

the Fund must enter into contracts with **accredited** health care service providers and health establishments at primary health care and hospital level

strategic purchasing of health care services, medicines, health goods and health related products from **accredited** and contracted health care service providers

Purpose of accreditation



- Eligible to contract with the NHI Fund
- Able to **meet contractual** obligations
- Delivers services of sufficient quality
- Incentivise and support to improvement in quality, health outcomes, user experience, etc.

Certification

 Health establishment must be inspected and certified by the OHSC

→ Are systems and processes in place to support quality in health care?







Registration

- All health care providers working in the health establishment must be registered with their statutory professional council (HPCSA, SANC, SAPC, etc.)
- → Are the health care provider delivering services considered adequately trained to deliver health care services?

Benefits

 Health establishment must provide the required range of health care service benefits

→ Is the range of health care service benefits in line with user-need, comprehensive, and at the appropriate level of care?







Skills mix

 Health establishment must have the right number of health care providers with the appropriate skills mix

→ Does the health establishment have the health care providers that will be able to deliver effective and safe care within their scopes of practice?

Evidence-informed care

- The health establishment must adhere to all nationally prescribed clinical guidelines, approved medicines and health products
- → Does the health establishment use medicines, products and clinical guidance that is effective, safe and not wasteful?







Referral pathways

 The health establishment must adhere to referral pathways

→ Is care coordinated across different health establishments, and can users access care that they need?







Information sharing

 The health establishment must submit a set of prescribed information to the Fund

→ Can a user's record be accessed at all facilities where they seek care?

Fair pricing

 Health establishment must follow the pricing regimen set by the NHI Fund


→ Are the prices that facilities use affordable?





Accreditation context









Conditional accreditation



- Section 39(12).
- Concessional arrangement that must be phased out.
- Regulations by Minister after consultation with OHSC.
- Health establishments that do not meet all requirements of accreditation → some leniency.
- Ensures that access is not unduly reduced, and that accreditation is inclusive.
- Supports the development of quality management.
