Levels of user involvement:


- Individual

Picker's Principles of Patient Centred Care











User's Experience of Care



A user experience of care designed to identify and address actual, systemic problems within the healthcare system.

- Importance of asking the right questions
 - Specific directed questions

Did the doctor give you enough information about your disease?

Do you understand why you are taking these tablets? Do you know the side effects of the medication you are taking?





User Related Outcomes



Desired end-goal: a change in user's knowledge, attitude, behaviour and health status.
