### PAEDIATRIC HOSPITAL LEVEL STANDARD TREATMENT GUIDELINES AND ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

  - **Chapter 4: Cardiovascular System** NEMLC accepted the chapter for *final ratification*.
  - Chapter 14: Paediatric Psychiatry NEMLC accepted the chapter for *final ratification*.
  - Chapter 24: Drug Allergies NEMLC accepted the chapter for *final ratification*.

# PRIMARY HEALTHCARE (PHC) AND ADULT HOSPITAL LEVEL STANDARD TREATMENT GUIDELINES AND ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

- The following have been reviewed and ratified for <u>external comment</u>, with the respective NEMLC report and respective medicine review(s):
  - **PHC Chapter 4: Cardiovascular conditions** NEMLC ratified the chapter for <u>external comment (see NEMLC bulletin for NEMLC meeting of 24 February 2022)</u>.
  - **Adult Hospital Level Chapter 3: Cardiovascular conditions -** NEMLC ratified the chapter for <u>external comment</u> with amendments.
    - Direct Oral Anticoagulants (DOACs) Medicine Review and Costing Patent court ruling against generic rivaroxaban (December 2021) requires the costing analysis for DOACs to be revised and retabled at the next NEMLC meeting (rivaroxaban supplied by generic companies to be withdrawn from the market).
  - PHC Chapter 2: Gastrointestinal Conditions NEMLC ratified the chapter for external comment.
  - Adult Hospital Level Chapter 1: Alimentary Tract NEMLC ratified the chapter for external comment.

- The updated **Topic Prioritisation Project Plan** was accepted by the NEMLC, noting that to-date:
  - o 21 reviews completed and NEMLC-ratified (prioritised on previous prioritisation tool).
  - 21 topics migrated from previous prioritisation tool to new tool, total of 35 topics prioritised (1 duplicate and 5 non-prioritised).
  - 13 additional identified topics for prioritisation.

#### TERTIARY AND QUATERNARY ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

- Historically Accepted Use:
  - Atorvastatin high dose familial hypercholesterolemia

NEMLC accepted the use of high dose atorvastatin for use in familial hypercholesterolemia in patients attending lipid clinics as prescribed by a specialist.

## THE ORIGIN OF ACE INHIBITORS

THE FIRST ACE INHIBITOR, CAPTOPRIL, WAS ORIGINALLY DERIVED FROM SNAKE VENOM. LAUNCHED IN 1981, CAPTOPRIL WAS BASED ON THE VENOM OF A POISONOUS BRAZILIAN VIPER (BOTHROPS JARARACA). PEPTIDES FROM THIS VENOM WAS ORIGINALLY TESTED ON DOG LUNGS, WHERE IT WAS DISCOVERED THAT THEY WERE ABLE TO BLOCK THE ACTIVITY OF ANGIOTENSIN CONVERTING ENZYME (ACE).
